

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

MERCOSUR – ASEAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE (MACC)

AND

LATIN AMERICAN NEW ZEALAND BUSINESS COUNCIL (LANZBC)

The Mercosur – ASEAN Chamber of Commerce (MACC) and the Latin American New Zealand Business Council (LANZBC), hereinafter referred to as “Parties” wishing to strengthen economic and trade ties between the Mercosur Region composed of the Argentine Republic, Federative Republic of Brazil, Republic of Paraguay, Eastern Republic of Uruguay, the Plurinational State of Bolivia and the Pacific Islands, have agreed to sign the following Agreement:

1. The Parties shall take all the opportunities within their competence to promote, strengthen and expand trade, economic, scientific, technological cooperation and other business relations between organisations and firms represented by both parties.
2. The Parties commit to exchange non-sensitive business, trade and economic information related to the markets in which they operate.
3. The Parties will assist and incentivize their members to interact and establish business contacts between each other with a view to strengthening their relations. Both parties will endeavour to organise joint events such as conferences, seminars, study tours, exchanges of trade groups and participation in trade fairs with the objective of promoting the growth of trade between the Mercosur region and New Zealand.
4. The Parties hereby endeavour to organize trade missions to explore areas of collaboration that will broaden the trade and investment cooperation between the countries.
5. The Parties shall undertake such other steps as needed to further the interest of both sides for the realization of this Agreement.




This Agreement shall take effect upon the date of its signing unless terminated through a written notice by anyone of the Parties involved.


